FOCUSING DOWNSTREAM

Welcome to One Truckee River's first Current - a new quarterly snapshot for stakeholders and partners of OTR in a quick-read format. Since One Truckee River Management Plan's unanimous adoption by local jurisdictions last fall, OTR has been in a celebratory mood, receiving multiple awards, hiring AmeriCorps members, and putting the plan into action.

Though we're still getting reports in from our 130 + stakeholders, progress is being made on multiple fronts. Some examples: Washoe County's three case workers have found homes for 52 formerly homeless residents (a number of whom previously lived on the river); the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection is moving full speed ahead on their Watershed Plan and Source Water Protection planning; and the fire departments of Reno and Sparks are collaborating with OTR on mile markers on the bike path in the urban

river corridor. The mile markers will greatly assist first responders in river rescues, in addition to helping recreational users find their way.

Though we're very much focused on implementing the plan, we're also looking to ensure a solid and sustainable future for OTR. A task force is considering long-term organization and partnership models for OTR with the help of National Park Service facilitator Barbara Rice. Though typically not as broad as OTR, several river communities across the West provide some interesting examples, and the group is soon to make its recommendations to the OTR Core Planning Team. As identified in the Plan, we believe strengthening One Truckee River for the long haul is essential to realizing the collective and ambitious vision for our beloved Truckee River. Alex Hoeft. 
FUNDING

- Truckee Meadows Water Authority provided OTR with a new grant through the Truckee River Fund at the Community Foundation of Western Nevada. This grant money will assist with implementation of phase one action items, and planning for phases two and three.
- Renown gifted OTR with funds to help with preparation and adoption of the phase one Management Plan.
