In 2018, the One Truckee River initiative is focused on four areas to ensure a healthy river connected to the Truckee Meadows

community. Those areas are listed below, along with notable progress points in each group.

SIGNAGE PLAN & RIVER SAFETY

Funding courtesy the Truckee River Fund has allowed One Truckee River to hire a consultant to create a Truckee River Master Signage Plan. Once this plan is completed (end of 2018/first thing 2019), a Washoe County State Question 1 grant is already in place to allow fabrication and installation of such signage plan. Stay tuned for details as we make progress!

FUNDING, METRICS FOR SUCCESS & STRUCTURE

A re-structuring of roles within this group is moving ideas forward for One Truckee River. The fulfillment of positions by key OTR stakeholders will yield the best brainstorming sessions and ideas for long-term initiative success.

HOUSING & SANITATION

Installation of a Portland Loo (simple, sturdy flush toilet kiosks located on sidewalks in public areas) is being considered by this group. Location, partners and maintenance is currently being discussed.

STORMWATER, VEGETATION MANAGEMENT, & WATERSHED MANAGEMENT

The Western Regional Water Commission (WRWC) has provided funding to complete a Tributary Management Plan (for the Truckee River Watershed) through the local Stormwater Committee. This will feed into the Truckee River Watershed Management Plan.
